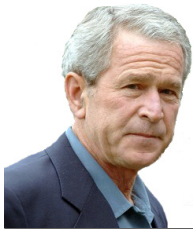


■ After the turmoil that surrounded the Oxford Union elections, The Oxyoron investigates the impact on the international community.
